Fownhope and District Carbon Reduction Action Group (CRAG) are currently looking for one last local business or organisation, which currently spend over £5000 annually on their heating bills, to install a wood-chip boiler and take part in their Woolhope Dome Community Wood Fuel Project.

The project is offering free wood-chip boilers and free installation and servicing to participating organisations within 15 miles of the Woolhope Dome area.

This innovative renewable energy project, which is a collaboration between Fownhope Carbon Reduction Action Group (CRAG) and Sharenergy, a not-for-profit organisation, aims to use sustainably harvested wood from local woodlands to fuel wood-chip boilers that will heat local business and community premises. The project will be run by a community-owned co-operative which will own and operate woodchip-powered boilers in local premises and provide fuel for these boilers from local sustainable sources.

Chris Boivin a CRAG Member said 'by installing a wood-chip boiler your organisation's carbon footprint will be dramatically reduced, your fuel will be sourced ethically and your business will be able to reduce its heating costs over a number of years'.
